# Rules for children

We decided to print these again as a reminder, before the High Holiday services:

- 1. Children will not go on the Bimah except as part of services or other temple business.
- 2. During services, children younger than six will sit with their parents. If the child needs to get up, a parent or older sibling will accompany him/her.
- 3. If a child is restless during services, he/she may play quietly on the terrace outside. The school building, usually closed during services, may be open during High Holiday services.
- 4. There will be no running in the temple or school building.

- 5. No one will touch the food at the oneg until after the blessings.
- 6. Children younger than ten will be served by an adult.

Parents are responsible for monitoring the behavior of their children, but any adult should intervene if children are behaving inappropriately.

If your children enter the school building during High Holiday services, please monitor them and be sure to clean up any materials or toys that they use.

which applies to every Jewish leader: "Be strong and brave. Do not be afraid or feel insecure before them. G-d, your Lord, is the One who is going with you, and He will not fail you nor forsake you."

How important is it in these days leading to Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur for us to remember that our choices lead us and our descendants to life and that when we trust G-d, he will not fail us.

Let's take the opportunity in the coming hours at the Temple to step out of our busy daily routines and meditate on our blessings, on our achievements, on how much the world and those around us would be different if we were not here. Let us meditate on how much our living affects the world with all of the thousands of small acts we do and how those acts make the world a better place.

In the Memorial service on Yom Kippur, we read: "Our life, at its best, is an endless effort for a goal we never attain. . . . Death finally terminates the struggle, and joy and grief, success and failure, all are ended."

But it doesn't need to be like that; the Torah tell us to CHOOSE LIFE. Life is not the goal but the journey. It is in the everyday; it is in the enjoyment of every breath, in every hug, in every sighting. It is in the small things — a cup of coffee, listening to your favorite music, reading a good book, having friends, being able to provide for one's self and

family. Life is in helping others, even in our bad moments that make us realize afterward how many other blessings we have.

So let's step out and think about this during the High Holidays, realize that if we are here, it is because G-d saw we were worth it. He is our partner, and I'm 100 percent sure that if we choose life, we will have a very good New Year.
