FROM THE RABBI

Shalom,

One of the most exciting aspects about being Jewish is the opportunity to pursue lifelong learning.

If we were privileged to live a thousand lifetimes, we still would not complete, much less master all of our sacred literature. To properly learn all 39 books of the Tanach — The Holy Scriptures — with all of the commentaries would in and of itself take a lifetime. The same is true of Talmud, Midrash, the Apocrypha, the Zohar, the Dead Sea Scrolls, the writings of Josephus, the great ethical works such as Mesillat Y'sharim (The Path of the Just) and modern theological writings such as the Tanya by Reb Schnuer Zalmon of Liady.

Ecclesiastes says in 12.12, "Of making books there is no end." And new works are written daily.

While trying to become at least somewhat familiar with our sacred writings, I continually strive to delve into new areas of Judaica, of which I am less familiar, and sometimes not familiar at all. If there are two sentences that I believe describe my spiritual quest they are (1) "My soul thirsts for the words of the Living G-D." And (2) "And he would gladly learn and gladly teach" from the Oxford Cleric in *Canterbury Tales*.

Therefore, this year in honor of our celebration of four decades of women in the rabbinate in America, I will be focusing on the history of women in Judaism.

As I am delving into this topic, I am realizing how little I know and how much I still have to learn!!!

For example, many of us may believe Sally Priesand was the first woman to receive s'michah (rabbinical ordination). But in fact, the first woman to be granted s'micha was Reginas Jonas in Munich, Germany, in 1935.

Throughout my life, I have discovered the most effective way to learn a subject is to teach it. Therefore, this coming year, EVERY Havdalah presentation will be dedicated to the topic of "The History and Impact of Women in the Rabbinate."

I look extremely forward to beginning this
