FROM THE RABBI

Shalom,

In his book, *Angel For Shabbat*, Rabbi Marc Angel relates a conversation he had with a gentleman who had recently retired.

Now that he had retired but probably had another 30 years of his life still remaining, he was contemplating what he should do next. How should he spend his years?

Life actually presents all of us with that question. What next? As Rabbi Angel points out, this question applies not merely to someone who has retired from his job, but rather to each indi-

vidual at every stage of life. We reach one plateau, achieve a particular goal — but then what?

In the *Al Hanissim* passage that we include in our Chanukah prayers, we recall that Almighty G-D helped our ancestors fight off their oppressors and granted the Jewish people a great victory. The passage continues: "ve-ahar kakh" (afterward), the Jews entered the Temple, lit the Menorah, and established the holiday of Chanukah. The key phrase is "ve-ahar kakh," afterward. This phrase reminds us that often having achieved one level, we need to move on to another higher level.

Life should never be lived passively.

Every morning of our lives when we arise, we need to remind ourselves: Now what? What have I planned as my next step?

For today, tomorrow, for the year ahead, as the next step in my life?

Life, as our Rabbinical sages tell us, is an ongoing process of renewal, of facing new struggles, of making new discoveries.

A thoughtful and generous life is not only a source of happiness to the person living such a life, but also has tremendous impact on others. Our ancestors lit the lights in the Temple, and therefore gave inspiration to all future generations. Their understanding of "ve-ahar kakh" enabled future generations to play their roles on the stage of history.

Rabbi Avraham Yitzchak Kook the first Ashkenazic chief rabbi of Israel was asked who was on a higher spiritual level — a person on a high rung on the spiritual ladder, or a person on a low rung? Rav Kook answered: It depends which direction the person is moving. If the person on a low rung is climbing and growing day by day, he or she is spiritually alive and energized.

If the person on a high rung is moving downward or simply remaining on that rung, he or she will continue to sink or stagnate unless he or she can redirect upward.

As we move on each rung of the ladder of life, we need to evaluate whether we are moving upward or whether we are letting ourselves remain stagnant or downward. As we will soon begin celebrating Chanukah and we are continually adding additional light in our Menorot for eight days, let us focus on how we can continually use the time G-D grants us in a meaningful and constructive way. If we dedicate ourselves to making our Congregation and Community as strong and as vibrant as it can be, then we are living in a meaningful and constructive way. If we are dedicated to being as charitable, compassionate, and helpful as we can be, then we are living meaningful and constructive lives. If we are continually learning and dedicated to the concept of pursuing knowledge in all areas, then we are living a meaningful and constructive life. If we are committed to Tikkun Olam all the days of our lives, then we are living meaningful and constructive lives. This requires planning, self discipline, and a focus on continual growth. We can succeed.

Like the candles on the Chanukah menorot, let our lights burn brighter and brighter.

Laurie and I wish everyone a wonderful and happy Chanukah, and to the Newman family, we say Mazel Tov on Joseph's upcoming Bar Mitzvah. We look extremely forward to seeing everyone soon!
